



DECLARING WAREHOUSED GOODS FOR HOME CONSUMPTION IN THE INTEGRATED CARGO SYSTEM

All goods entered into home consumption from a warehouse (import declaration (Nature 30)) need to be made using Customs Integrated Cargo System (ICS). Import declarations and warehouse declarations have replaced import and warehouse entries. These declarations are similar to the previous entries and must be used for all consignments with a value greater than the entry threshold for goods imported by air, sea, or post.

This table provides a comparison between the old terminology and the current terminology.

This fact sheet outlines the requirements for completing an import declaration using the ICS when the entry for warehouse has been made in COMPILE.

It also provides crucial information for clients completing an import declaration using Customs Interactive. For those who have elected to use electronic data interchange (EDI) software, completing an import declaration (Nature 30) in the ICS will be seamless. EDI users' software developers will cater for these arrangements.

Owners who have completed an entry for warehousing in COMPILE and are entering the goods for home consumption on or after import cut-over, must use an import declaration in the ICS.

To do this, the 'Multiple Clearance Code' field on the ex-warehouse 'Import Declaration Tariff Line Create' screen must be used to record the first eight alpha/numeric digits of the original entry for warehousing reference number, leaving the 'Warehouse Reference Declaration ID' field blank. The 'Warehouse Reference Declaration ID' field is only used for warehouse declarations created in the ICS.

The complete 11-digit entry for warehousing number, plus the Warehouse Related Line (WRL) number, must be entered in the goods description field to create an audit path. The example screen-shot illustrates where the 'Multiple Clearance Code' field is located on an 'Import Declaration (Nature 30) Tariff Line' create screen.

If goods have been entered for warehousing on a warehouse declaration in the ICS, the ex-warehouse import declaration for those goods must also be made in the ICS.

The details of the warehouse declaration (Nature 20) must be entered in the Warehouse Reference Declaration ID' field.

If a documentary form is being lodged for any declaration type, the owner must complete the appropriate Customs approved form. Approved forms can be located on the Customs Internet www.customs.gov.au under media, publications and forms. When lodging any documentary declaration form, an evidence of identity (EOI) check will need to be undertaken.
