Integrated Cargo System - Business Continuity Plan SA and NT Workshops

INTRODUCTION

Customs have developed a Business Continuity Plan (BCP) to guide the risk assessment, reporting and clearance process for the legitimate movement of cargo during any declared contingency period.

Since the implementation of the BCP in December 2006 awareness of the BCP has been limited within some Industry sectors. A number of outages have occurred over the past six months, both ICS and client cargo systems. During these times feedback from Industry to Customs has indicated that there is a lack of detailed understanding of clients roles and responsibilities in the event of an outage. To address this issue a pilot training workshop was conducted in conjunction with the CBFCA in August 2007. The success of these workshops was confirmed via very positive feedback and has provided the basis for further workshops to be conducted.

APPROACH

It is proposed that Customs present BCP workshops on a region-by-region basis. This will include a number of BCP workshops and site visits to organisations that identify a need for on-site training. Clients that will find the workshops relevant and who are encouraged to participate include:

- Exporters
- Brokers
- Freight Forwarders
- Depots
- Release Establishments
- Software Developers

In South Australia there will be two workshops presented in Adelaide. In Northern Territory there will be one workshop presented in Darwin. Each workshop will run for two hours and will be limited to a maximum of 20 participants, which allows for concentrated discussion and participation. More workshops will be allocated on a needs basis.

These workshops are structured to provide participants with an overview of BCP via a PowerPoint presentation for the first hour, then an interactive session for the following hour. This interactive session involves participants acting out scenarios that will be relevant to them in the event of an outage, submitting contingency data and receiving response message from Customs. This will provide clients with a better understanding of the end-to-end BCP process. These workshops will also demonstrate the simplicity of using the BCP its supporting documentation to operate during a contingency situation.

Workshop participants will be provided with a copy of the BCP presentation and one page 'quick guide' on BCP.
